

Pen Y Fron Chapel & Quarry (SJ197 658)

If you take the Pen Y Fron Road out of Pantymwyn, bearing left at a junction, to continue on a narrowing winding road until you see Pen Y Fron Chapel in front of you.

Visitors can park their car on the C.P. to the right of the front wall.

The chapel was restored by local volunteers some 30 years ago where their ancestors are buried.

Money for the upkeep is obtained from regular Soup Luncheons in Pantymwyn Village Hall.

The chapel is in a lovely setting and well worth the visit.

If you would like a little walk, then go a little way passed the chapel where you will see a footpath sign on your left.

The sign points to quite a steep track which you descend, ignoring paths to your right and left. At the bottom as the path takes you left you are met with a surprising view.

The old weathered quarry face of Pen Y Fron Quarry. If you explore the surrounding area you will find quite a few remains from the old working days of the quarry.
